Making A Watch

After making my class of young learners some clocks for class to practice time, one of my little boys said to me, "Teacher, I don't like clocks! I like watches!"

I thought about this for a bit and decided that if I can make my class a clock, surely I could make them watches using the same method. It just needed to be a bit smaller.

I got my tools (scissors, paper, hole punch, knife, laminating machine) and went to work on designing some different shaped watches and bands on a power point slide, converting the finished images into PNG files to add to a word document later.

Anyway, long story short, I designed these great little watches using pins to hold the watch hands in place and allowing them to spin to change the time. I added Velcro to the wrist bands to attach them to the wrist.


I introduced these into my very next class to try them out and I got a great response from the kids. The best was when they asked me if they could keep them, which I replied, "I've only made 2 so far, but I will let you cut and color your own to make later if we have time."

These were a big hit in my class and are not too hard to make. I have put lots of watch designs here to choose from and make, including blank templates if you want your young learners to practice cutting and coloring.












Choose a watch face. Cut and Color it to make your own design.










Clock Hands Sets for each watch








Choose a watch wrist band. Cut and Color it to make your own design.




